

Catch-up Premium

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve [the expected standard](#) in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

The Government makes allocations to state-funded schools including academies like St Catherine's College.

St Catherine's College is therefore required to publish:

- a) the funding allocation for the current academic year
- b) details of how the funds intend to be spent
- c) details of how the previous year's allocation was spent
- d) how last year's allocation made a difference to the attainment of the pupils who benefit from the funding

c) Details Of How St Catherine’s College Spent The 2015-16 Allocation and It Impact: £13,500

In addition to the intervention listed below, St Catherine’s College also has reduced class sizes and in-class TA support that also supports progress for pupils with low prior attainment.
