Quiz Question: In 1966, football manager, Alf Ramsey, guided England to victory in the FIFA World Cup, but who has been the most successful England coach since then?

Apart from 1966, the England first team has not progressed past the World Cup

quarter-finals but last year the U-17 and U-20 teams both won their respective World Cup competitions. However, between 1966 and 2017, the main contender for title of 'Most Successful England Coach' was a man called Lyndon Lynch.

Before Easter, I travelled with seven St Catherine's College students to the University of Brighton where we were introduced to Lyndon Lynch. Mr Lynch presented our students with certificates at a celebration event marking their participation in a six-week mentoring scheme tailored for Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) students. The programme provides an

opportunity for BAME school students to consider issues around identity and being aspiration, whilst mentored by **BAME** university students. The university students made great role models as they have had similar experiences to our students, achieved places at university and have high aspirations for their futures.



The university's BAME Mentoring Programme is led by Mr John Lynch, brother to Mr Lyndon Lynch, the guest of honour at last week's event. Our students heard that, as boys, John and Lyndon were not encouraged by their school to have high aspirations due to their ethnicity. However, John became a successful primary school headteacher and Lyndon the manager of the England Learning Disability football team that won the 2002 World Cup in Tokyo. Lyndon also coached the Team GB Cerebral Palsy football team at the Beijing and London Olympics, was awarded the Mussabini Medal for coaching outstanding success on the world stage, and has one of the changing rooms named after him at

England's prestige football training facility, St Georges Park.

Our College's mission is to help every child achieve his/ her God-given potential. Success in all its forms should be available to all, irrespective of race, gender, sexuality, or any other discrimination. We were pleased to be able to offer our students the opportunity to participate in the BAME mentoring programme, and the feedback we have received from the students and mentors has been very positive.
