NOTICE FROM EAST SUSSEX HIGHWAYS

On Saturday 10 March, road repairs will start on Langney Rise, Eastbourne. These repairs will include carriageway recycling and carriageway jointing. Carriageway recycling involves digging up the existing road surface and re-laying it.

These works are scheduled to last for two weeks. Works will be carried out in phases to minimise disruption.

Phase 1: Starts Saturday 10 March Langney Roundabout to Pembury Road

Carriageway recycling, iron works and surfacing for four days. Due to the nature of these works, the road will be closed 24 hours a day during this time. On Tuesday 13 March, the whole of Langney Rise will be closed to through traffic.

Phase 2: Starts Wednesday 14 March Langney Roundabout to Pembury Road

Carriageway jointing works for five days (now weekend working). Road closed 7.00pm - 5.00am.

Phase 3: Starts Wednesday 21 March Pembury Road to the Rising

Carriageway jointing works for one night. Road closed 7.00pm - 5.00am.

Phase 4: Starts Thursday 22 March The Rising to Hide Hollow

Carriageway jointing works for two nights. Road closed 7.00pm - 5.00am.
