We want to apologise again for having to close the School to some year groups. We understand the huge implications this has on families and the additional pressures put on you. We remain very grateful to you all for your continued good will and support.

We are relieved that there have been no further confirmed live cases in school this week. However, for the purpose of 'Track and Trace', should a student develop Covid-19 symptoms this weekend (19/20 December) and subsequently test positive, please follow the guidance on our web page which can be found here: <u>Covid-19 Web Page</u>

You may have heard the government's latest announcement regarding mass-testing in schools and a national staggered start to Term 3. We have officially been informed today that only year 11 students will return to school on Tuesday 5 January. All other students will receive their full timetable of lessons remotely, live via Teams until Monday 11 January 2021.
