At St Catherine's College, it is important that children should be able to learn in a supportive, friendly and safe environment based on Christian care, without fear of being bullied, so that they can develop to their full potential. Sadly, pupils may experience unpleasant situations at some time in their school years. acknowledge that both friendship problems and bullying behaviour can be extremely upsetting for our pupils. It is important to distinguish between the two as the responses to friendship problems are likely to be different to strategies used to address bullying behaviour. At St Catherine's College we use the Anti-Bullying Alliance definition of bullying as 'the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power.' Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or through cyberspace.

Young people often feel they must deal with bullying alone, and they may worry that telling a parent/carer will make the parent/carer angry or upset. important that parents/carers have the tools to keep their child safe, happy and free from bullying.

The Diana Award Anti-Bullying Campaign has a useful guide for helping parents/carers should they believe that bullying is happening at school. It is called 'Supporting Your Child If They're Being Bullied: A Guide for Parents & Carers'. A copy can be found on the Advice for Parents section of the Anti-Bullying Alliance website. In the guide, it encourages parents to, 'ring up and ask to speak to someone and stress your concern. Don't let your own experience of school get in the way of your child's experience. Try not to take your child out of school or keep them off. This can often make it harder to get them back to school and doesn't give the school the chance to sort out the problem.' At St Catherine's, we encourage you to call Student Services and ask your child's Assistant Head of Year for support or advice.

This week, 120 Year 9 pupils carried out fieldwork at the River Cuckmere. These are important skills for their GCSE paper 3 exam and this trip gave them an opportunity to practise those skills. We carried out a traffic and pedestrian survey; an environmental quality survey and completed a land use map, field sketch and public questionnaire. We also looked at the impact of tourists on footpath erosion and recorded vegetation cover and infiltration rates. Pupils worked incredibly hard and were very polite when talking to the public.
