ENGINEERING CHALLENGE

On Friday 24 January, four of our year 7 pupils, along with a member of staff, travelled to Bede's School to take part in the annual Engineers Challenge, which has now been running for 27 years.

Although they had been given no idea of what this challenge would entail, nor what would be expected of them, our team travelled to the event filled with boundless enthusiasm and an eagerness to do well.

Competing against six other schools from the Eastbourne area, the teams' challenge was to use the power of pneumatics and hydraulics to build and operate a robotic arm. This had to be a working model capable of picking up objects with the purpose of moving them from one position to another and then stacking them.

The difficulty of this challenge was not only in the fact that they had construct the arm but, to operate it in the manner that the challenge demanded, required all four of the contestants to work together so as to control different functions of the operation at the same time. This required exceptional teamwork from the four children who had never worked in such an environment before.

Despite stiff competition from the other six teams in the competition, our St Catherine's team, 'The Fantastic Four', achieved top marks and were awarded the trophy for 2020. This is currently on display in Visitor Reception.

Each pupil received a personal certificate and small prize whilst the School received the trophy for this year; a certificate of achievement; and a building kit that can be used by other pupils to experiment in building a model based on the original challenge.

Our team were incredible representatives for our school and both staff and pupils of St Catherine's College are very proud of them. Huge congratulations on their tremendous achievement!



ho are **voung carers**'

A young carer is someone under 18 who regularly helps look after someone in their family, or a friend, who is ill, disabled or misuses drugs or alcohol.

How many young carers are t

- There are about 700,000 young carers in the UK. (BBC 2010)*
- That's about 1 in 12 secondary aged pupils.
- There are likely to be young carers in every school and college.

Who do young carers care for?

- Young carers care for someone:
- With an illness or disability.
- With a mental health condition.
- Who misuses drugs or alcohol.

What might a young carer do?

- Practical tasks, such as cooking, housework and shopping.
- Physical care, such as helping. someone out of bed.
- Emotional support.
- Personal care, such as helping. someone dress.
- Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions.
- Helping to give someone their
- Helping someone communicate:
- Looking after brothers and sisters.

roung carers should have:

- The time to be a young person.
- The same opportunities as their friends.
- Good support for the person they help look after.

Being a young carer can have a big impact on the things that are important to growing up

- It can affect a young person's health, social life
- and self-confidence. Many young carers struggle to juggle their
- education and caring which can cause pressure
- and stress. In a survey, 39% said that nobody in their school
- was aware of their caring role. 26% have been bullied at school
- because of their caring role. 1 in 20 miss school because of their
- caring role.
