So, as Jesus said, treating others as we want to be treated ourselves is an important part of learning how we choose to relate to others. We have talked about these things in school worships; in tutor times; and during lessons and it is hugely encouraging to see how pupils are behaving well around the School; giving to our House

charities; and contributing to local charities such as the Eastbourne Foodbank where students gave generously to those less fortunate than themselves.

We believe that by being responsible and helping others, children also learn about what they need to do to care for themselves, a home and a family. They learn skills that they can use in their adult lives, like preparing meals, cleaning, organising and other activities that contribute to the home.

Wishing you the very best for Christmas. May the holiday season fill your home with joy and your heart with love and generosity for others.

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OFSTED

We would like to say a heartfelt thank you to every member of the St Catherine's Community, especially to our pupils. As you all know, we recently had an Ofsted Inspection. Inspectors visited lessons; looked at work; interviewed staff and pupils; and looked at surveys from pupils, staff and parents. The process was tough, and we know that some pupils found it quite difficult. In true St Catherine's style though, pupils demonstrated how proud they are to be members of the School Community and shared their excellent work. We are pleased to let you know that the Ofsted Report is now published and it says many wonderful things about our pupils. Some of the highlights include:

- "Pupils are happy and optimistic." The process of growing up has never been
 easy, but our pupils were recognised as being positive and well supported. "A
 pupil spoke for many when they said, 'I like everything about this school."
- "Pupils feel safe". A school's primary responsibility is the safety of its pupils and this permeates all that we do. The report goes on to recognise the support provided to ensure children's safety and welfare.
- Visitors to St Catherine's always comment on how calm and quiet the School is.
 Ofsted was no exception and wrote that the School "sets very high standards for pupils' behaviour. Pupils respect these expectations. As a result, behaviour is good in this school and classrooms are calm and purposeful." The inspectors commented verbally that they had not seen a single incident of inappropriate behaviour.
- Recognition that the pupils are working hard, and harder than ever before.
 Ofsted commented that "Pupils are achieving better" and that "Staff work very
 well together to help pupils fulfil their potential." They saw pupils and staff
 working effectively together in "interesting lessons planned to engage and
 challenge pupils to learn and remember more."

The full report is attached with this newsletter. We are pleased that developments in the School have been recognised and validated, with Ofsted describing improvements as "rapid" and that there is a "culture of high ambition and success." They have made some helpful suggestions for the School's next steps; namely to complete our curriculum design work and to ensure this curriculum is adapted for pupils with SEND so their needs are met more fully.

Ofsted saw the strength of our church school community as they reported upon the "powerful team camaraderie present in this school". St Catherine's continues to look forward with confidence and determination as we inspire and support our pupils to achieve their God-given potential.

We are very grateful for the on-going support of everyone in the St Catherine's College Community.

There is a free delivery service for orders over £50 and a small charge of £3.95 for orders less than £50. Delivery is within 2-5 working days.

Price and Buckland will be in school for our Year 7 Induction Evening in June and parents/carers with pupils in other year groups will be welcome to come along, to an earlier slot on this day, to purchase uniform. The company will offer free delivery for two weeks following Induction Evening. Uniform will also be available to try on after school in Student Services prior to placing an order with Price and Buckland.

Additionally, we are also pleased to announce that as of 1 January 2020 we will be phasing in a new, more competitively priced PE kit. It will be phased as follows:

- All pupils available from 1 January 2020
- Current Year 6 (new intake 2020) new kit only
- Current Years 7-8 current PE kit may be worn until July 2021
- Current Years 9-11 new kit available but no obligation to change
