Last year, the Government provided new statutory guidance on the teaching of relationships, sex and health education. Along with citizenship and careers education, these topics are taught at St Catherine's College under the title of 'Life Skills'.

The foreword to the Government's guidance says, 'Today's children and young people are growing up in an increasingly complex world and living their lives seamlessly on and offline. This presents many positive and exciting opportunities, but also challenges and risks. In this environment, children and young people need to know how to be safe and healthy, and how to manage their academic, personal and social lives in a positive way.'

Last term, we ran another successful Life Skills Week with a range of topics being taught. In upper school Year 10 learned new careers skills in preparation for Work Experience Week and Year 11 developed their knowledge and attitudes around relationships and sexual health. In Key Stage 3, the year groups had lessons on the theme 'Healthy and Safe'.

Our Life Skills curriculum supports our pupils in acquiring the knowledge and skills they need to manage their lives, and to consider their own attitudes and those of others. With these aims, the Life Skills Week helped Year 7 pupils learn about the importance of road safety and sleep; Year 8 practice first aid skills; and Year 9 explore both healthy and unhealthy strategies for dealing with difficult situations.

We are grateful to the East Sussex Fire Service, East Sussex Healthy Schools Service and the Know Knives Project for their support in delivering the 'healthy and safe' messages.

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ANTI-BULLYING



Several of the lessons taught during Life Skills Week provided our pupils with opportunities to reflect on situations that may result in bullying behaviour.

During the 'Healthy and Safe' topic in Key Stage 3, pupils had lessons that provided strategies that promoted positive mental health and wellbeing. These were, Promoting Emotional Wellbeing (Year 7), Digital Resilience (Year 8), and Healthy Coping Strategies (Year 9).

In Year 11, the Relationships and Sexual Health lessons included Managing Unhealthy Relationships and Consent and Coercion.

In addition to the education around anti-bullying and wellbeing, the practical action of designating two sets of toilets as KS3 and KS4 use only has taken place. The Pupil Leadership proposed this following a Happy and Safe Survey of pupils.

FAIRTRADE FORTNIGHT 2020

For two weeks each year thousands of individuals, companies and groups across the UK come together to share the stories of the people in developing countries who grow our food and drinks, and the cotton in our clothes - people who are often exploited and underpaid.

Fairtrade Fortnight was celebrated throughout the School. We were treated to Fairtrade chocolate desserts in the café, and Fairtrade messages were shared in Worship. In Life Skills lessons, pupils watched a new film about a family of cocoa farmers from Sierra Leone, West Africa. 'Guardians of the Rainforest' tells the story of how a group of cocoa farmers have come together to protect the rainforest and develop their communities through Fairtrade. https://vimeo.com/388217600

College Worship last week was led by pupils from the Global Awareness Group. They added their voices in the call for cocoa farmers to earn a living wage and shared stories that showed the positive impact that Fairtrade has on the women behind your chocolate bar. The pupils challenged us to consider the injustices of world trade when we do our shopping. The message was that our everyday choices affect the lives of others, even when we decide which chocolate bar to buy.

During Worship, pupils were invited to take part in a 'Blindfold Fairtrade Chocolate Challenge'. The challenge was to eat squares of Fairtrade chocolate each one flavoured with a second Fairtrade product that had to be identified. Thankfully, the mystery products did not include Fairtrade olive oil, black pepper or mango body wash!
