# **READING AT ST CATHERINE'S**



A report from Ms Simpson:

For students to stand shoulder to shoulder with their peers, locally, nationally and globally, we must ensure that they are reading regularly. 90% of a child's vocabulary comes from reading. If your child is a reluctant reader, then they are placing themselves at a disadvantage.

To encourage reading, St Catherine's is beginning to

'Register and Read'! Fortnightly, on a specific day of Week B, each Tutor group will read either a fictional extract, or a piece of non-fiction writing. These texts will be challenging, interesting and



will hopefully expose our students to vocabulary and language they have not yet encountered. We will be expecting students to engage with what they are reading, ask questions and take control of discussions, with support and guidance from their tutors.



All teachers at St Catherine's display what they are currently reading, whether it is non-fiction or fiction and we encourage all students to ask about these books. We would love support from parents, carers and families to engage in the discussion with why it is so beneficial to read and also what you are reading at home.

In addition to our dedicated fortnightly opportunities for reading and discussion during Tutor time, we have bolstered our Library with copies of new books from recommended reading lists, chosen by the English Department, specific to each year group. Students are encouraged to visit the library at lunchtime and after school to check out a book, talk to our wonderful librarian for recommendations and then get reading! The expectation at St Catherine's is that every student should have a book to read in their bags; with our new additions, this would be a perfect opportunity to peruse our lovely, new collection and find a book that will be perfect for them.

# A REPORT FROM MRS HOLROYD, SENCO

At St Catherine's College, we are committed to offering an inclusive curriculum to ensure the best possible progress for all of our students, whatever their needs or abilities. All students are valued, given a sense of selfworth and are helped to develop confidence in their abilities and strengths throughout their school experience.

This year we have extended our team to include four Higher Level Teaching Assistant (HLTA) staff who work closely with the curriculum teams to support small groups of students in:

- Speech and Language Therapy
- Emotional Literacy
- Numeracy and Literacy

All students have access to a range of 'Ready to learn' strategies which are displayed in all classrooms. These are also on pages 144-147 of the Student Diary. With the encouragement of the teacher, students are supported through quality first teaching (QFT) to develop their learning skills and independence.

# ATTENDANCE FACTS

A report from Mr Watts: Better attendance leads to better outcomes! Below is a table, based on this year's Year 11 GCSE Results, that shows a clear correlation of higher attendance = better outcomes.

100%	6
99.9-97%	5.25
96.9-93%	4
92.9-90%	3.75
Less than 90%	2

Excellent attendance habits established early on will make a difference to a student's life, both academically and in their future chosen workplace. Attendance incentives, rewards and support are provided by the school to help Students make every day matter.

# FORMER PUPIL ACCEPTED AT CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY

Huge congratulations to Thomas Finn, former pupil, who has been accepted to study Maths at Trinity College, Cambridge, after achieving 3 A\*s and an A in his A Levels, and top grades in the Cambridge Maths papers (STEP).

Thomas left St Catherine's College in 2017 and studied maths, further maths, physics and computer science at Bexhill College.

Whilst at St Catherine's, Thomas participated in the Intermediate Maths Challenge and scored highly in the Senior Challenge and Olympiad papers. As a result of this, he was selected for the UK team which took part in the Balkan Mathematical Olympiad in Moldova in May. Thomas was awarded a bronze medal for his performance in the two 4.5 hour papers. Well done Thomas!

#### ANTI-BULLYING

# A report from Mr Pittman:

Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at St Catherine's College. We believe that all children should be able to learn in a supportive, friendly and safe environment based on Christian care, without fear of being bullied, so that they can achieve their God-given potential. We encourage parents to contact their child's Assistant Head of Year should they have a concern about bullying or any unpleasant behaviour.

In our college, we define bullying as the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or through cyberspace.

Sometimes pupils have friendship problems which can be extremely upsetting and unpleasant. It is important to distinguish between these and bullying as they are likely to be addressed in different ways. However, we recognise that repeated friendship problems can sometimes lead to bullying behaviour. In all cases we will respond swiftly and take the appropriate actions.

At St Catherine's we have a 'listening culture'. Pupils are encouraged to report upsetting incidents to a wide range of adults like their parent, Tutor, Head of Year or Assistant Head of Year, or any other staff member. They can speak to the member of staff in person; send an email to the member of staff's work email or to bullying@stcatherines.college or place a message in the anti-bullying box in Student Services.
