As a school, we understand the vital importance of reading - the value of being able to transport your child to another world through a book. In a time obsessed with social media and technology, reading is becoming a forgotten passion, something that we won't stand for!

At St Catherine's, we have been working hard to ensure that reading is not only encouraged, but that opportunities for reading are provided for your child. As you know, all students are expected to carry a reading book in their bag, in case they are asked to silently read at the start of a lesson, for example. We found that this was not enough so we have implemented some reading initiatives.

# **Register and Read**

During Wednesday or Friday of every Week B, your child will read a fiction or non-fiction text with their tutor. We have chosen texts that are engaging, interesting and, more importantly, that expose them to vocabulary and ideas they might not necessarily have come across before. Students have been engaged, asking questions and have had some really meaningful debates about the topics covered. Please ask your children about the different texts they have read!

Before we broke up for the summer and Christmas holidays, we set challenges for our students to keep track of what they were reading, have it signed at home and bring it in. The results were brilliant! It was heartening to see so many students making such marked

Interesting vocabulary was displayed around the School and students were encouraged to write these down and find the definitions. There were some amazing discussions taking place, important questions raised and themes discussed that will hopefully stay with your child. Students will also

see a short film adaptation during tutor time.


# What's in the future?




Each year we hold a whole school collection for our local Foodbank and I am delighted to report that our collection amounted to a staggering 384.3kgs which provided 385 meals.
