Physicists can work in many industries and can be involved in:

- ⇒ Climate forecasting
- ⇒ Developing medical instruments and treatments
- ⇒ Working in satellite technology and space exploration
- ⇒ Investigating new ways to generate power
- ⇒ Developing robotics and artificial intelligence
- ⇒ Teach in schools, colleges or universities
- ⇒ Journalism, broadcasting or publishing

Depending on your role and level of qualification you could earn between £14,000 and upwards of £70,000 per year.
