WHAT IS IT?

The world's oceans and seas cover 70% of the planet and many people make a career from studying them and the life that can be found there.

- ⇒ Oceanographers study the seas and oceans and how they work
- ⇒ Marine scientists study and research the animals and plants living in the oceans
- ⇒ Hydrographic surveyors use state-of-the-art tech to study and map the ocean floors—climb mountains under the seas!
- ⇒ Hydrologists and hydrogeologists study the flow of water over and under the ground
