**Dear Parents and Carers**

### **Festive Christmas Dinner**

The cost of Christmas dinner is £3.00, and we will debit this from your ParentPay account on the day. If your child is eligible for free school meals, they will also need to collect a ticket. Students choosing not to have Christmas dinner should bring a packed lunch. However, there will be a limited menu available at breaktime on these days.

# **Last Day of Term**

The last day of the term is Friday 15 December, when we will close at 12:30pm. To facilitate this earlier closure, we have amended the college day:
