As part of our ongoing commitment to ensuring that every student feels safe and supported both in and outside of school, we are pleased to announce that we will be working in partnership with Sussex Police over the coming year on a number of initiatives aimed at safeguarding and educating our students.

This collaboration will involve a range of activities designed to promote personal safety, community responsibility, and positive decision-making. Throughout the year, Sussex Police will deliver a series of education sessions that will cover important topics such as personal safety, online safety, and the importance of community involvement.
