Hello, my name is Mr Watts and I am a PE teacher and Head of Year 8 at St Catherine's College. I am also Key Stage 3 Lead for Learning. In this week's Contact, I am writing about a

key part of my role at St Catherine's College, which is pastoral care.

Pastoral care in schools encompasses a variety of responsibilities and roles, ranging from pastoral officers, tutors, educational psychologists and behaviour specialists.

At St Catherine's, our clear pastoral vision is to ensure that students make at least expected progress in all lessons. Within the pastoral team we aim to support teachers and tutors by working together to create a calm learning environment where behaviour is excellent. This is achieved through regular visits to the classroom, meetings with parents and students and putting interventions in place where support is required. The checking of students' diaries in every lesson and tutor time, alongside running weekly behaviour point reports, ensure that high expectations are met and that students are doing their best around school.

Attendance is also important to student achievement and is another area of pastoral care. We constantly monitor attendance by reporting to tutors and parents on a regular basis so that any frequent absenteeism is addressed quickly. We also work closely with parents and students to maximise attendance, as any lesson missed can mean they are a step behind their peers and in their progress.


The pastoral team puts each student's needs at the forefront of its work. We strive to support all students with any emotional or behavioural support they need.

Our high expectations are set not only by teachers and staff but also by the students themselves. The pastoral team listens closely to the student voice and encourages students to share their views and aspirations for the school. By working as a group, we build trustworthy

relationships where students feel supported and know that their beliefs and concerns are listened to.

To encourage and reward students for meeting the high expectations set by all, frequent prizes and house points are given to those who exceed their potential in behaviour, attendance and conduct around the school. The pastoral team believes that rewards and praise are just as important to the welfare and development of students and we aim to always award these where they are deserved.
