ITALY TRIP

A report from Mrs Bawden:

During half-term, 38 pupils accompanied four teachers on an RE, art and photography exploration of Rome, Florence and Siena.

Whilst in Rome we visited the Colosseum; climbed St Peter's Basilica; saw Michaelangelo's frescoes in the Sistine Chapel and spent time in Villa Borghese.



We also had a day in Siena which is our namesake's birth place. Whilst there, we saw where St Catherine lived and the teachers shared

information about her life with the pupils. We then visited the church where her head is kept as a relic. I think the trip really helped to give a sense that St Catherine was a real person.

In Florence, the pupils had time to visit the Ponte Vecchio and saw breath-taking views of the city from Piazzale Michaelangelo. The architecture, art, religious venues and historically significant places that we visited on the trip will leave a lasting impression on all involved.
