Apple or orange? Starter or pudding? Tea or coffee? We are all faced with choices and decisions to make on a daily basis, some more difficult than others. Tuesday 13 March saw the launch of our Pathways model for Year 8, our revamped Options Evening. Over 300

parents, carers and pupils were at the event and they had the opportunity to speak with members of staff from all options subjects who were on hand to offer advice about their subject. There was a lovely buzz about the school as children considered their strengths in subject areas and what subjects will be beneficial to their college and potential university careers and beyond. It was also great to see so many of our children studiously reading their pathways booklets to glean as much information as they could to support the choices that they will have to make.

This year, we are actively encouraging our pupils to follow the English Baccalaureate (EBacc) suite of qualifications, regardless of pathway. This suite of qualifications includes a language and a humanities option. A study by the Sutton Trust reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and Maths, while research by the UCL Institute of Education shows that taking the EBacc enhances prospects for entering further education or employment.

I studied languages at school; French 'A' Level and Spanish GCSE. For me, the languages I studied helped me to understand the mechanics of our own language further, which, in turn, has supported my teaching of English. Speaking French and Spanish on my annual trip to Spain, I surprised a number of people who were not expecting an English lady to be able to speak anything other than English and, although not always perfect, I can engage in conversation and have even managed a joke or two!

We are fortunate as a college to be able to offer three languages; French, Spanish and Mandarin. Year 8 already have a whole year of a language under their belt and, hopefully, this will help guide them towards their decision. Bonne chance avec tes choix, Year 8!
