As we know, most of us, including our children, now use mobiles, iPads and tablets to communicate as part of our everyday lives. If we ensure that our children are following safety guidelines in their online lives, the use of IT can be amazing. Unfortunately, not everyone using IT is as sensible or kind as they should be. I wanted to share a recent East Sussex Police update called 'bait out.' This is a worrying new trend where children are sharing nude images of their peers in an attempt to bully them.

Teenagers use a 'bait out' strategy where they launch a social media page and only allow access once a sexual image has been shared. This is more frequently aimed at girls who tend to be more vulnerable.


