Next week is **Anti-Bullying Week 2017** with the theme 'All Different, All Equal'. During the week, we will be encouraging all students, staff and parents to take action against bullying throughout the year as well as celebrating difference and equality. Our

aim is to create a safe environment where children can be themselves and where students are empowered to report bullying and not be bystanders.

Staff and students are encouraged to be individual, celebrate difference and show support for Anti-Bullying Week by wearing odd socks at school next week!

Recently in College Worship, I made reference to a number of historical drama movies that have influenced my thinking. Through the medium of film, I can gain a better understanding of people who have very different experiences to my own. In the 'Danish Girl', Eddie Redmayne plays Einar Wegener, whose voyage of selfdiscovery ultimately leads to the first ever sex-change operation, and, in 'The Imitation Game', the autistic and mathematician, Alan **Turing** (Benedict Cumberbatch), tries to crack the enigma code used by the Nazis in World War II. The films' taglines are 'Find the courage to be yourself' and 'The true enigma was the man who cracked the code'.

During Worship, I also showed two film clips. 'Suffragette' showed the fight for equality by radicalised women in 1921 and 'Hidden Figures', set at NASA in 1961, depicted a talented group of African-American female mathematicians who served as 'human computers' calculating the launch of the first US astronaut into space. 'Genius has no race. Strength has no gender. Courage has no limit' (Hidden Figures).

The theme of Worship was one of equality for all regardless of gender, race, religion, disability, sexuality or gender identity, and the Worship provided an opportunity to invite students to our new equality group. **The E-Team** meets every Monday lunchtime with the aim to discuss equality issues and celebrate the diversity of identities found in our school community.
