As mentioned in Mr Talbot's article, I have been working closely with Eastbourne Foodbank for their 'Fill a Bag, Give a Gift' Christmas campaign by providing Christmas food for needy families. Two representatives from the Foodbank came into school to pick up the food we had collected. The representatives were 'shocked' at how much we had!

Worships have been delivered to all year groups, asking pupils what they like about Christmas (presents, twinkly lights, food, family, etc) and then I asked them to consider what Christmas would be like if their families could not afford to provide those things. I gave case studies of people who had to use foodbanks and reminded pupils not to be stereotypical about who uses them; that all sorts of circumstances lead to people needing the support of a foodbank.

Tutor groups were challenged to 'fill a bag, give a gift' by filling a 'bag for life' with food items and, in addition, to donate one gift for a child or adult for Christmas. Every tutor group donated so there were over 40 bags of donations. Some tutor groups even donated more than one, which was brilliant!

All of the food and gifts donated will now be allocated to families during the Christmas period.
